Clases presenciales del modelo de docencia A1 para cada estudiante: 31 horas de enseñanzas básicas (EB), 14 horas de enseñanzas prácticas y de desarrollo (EPD) y 0 horas de actividades dirigidas (AD). Hasta un 10% de la enseñanza presencial puede sustituirse por docencia a distancia (también presencial, pero posiblemente asincrónica), de acuerdo con la programación de la Asignatura publicada antes del comienzo del curso.

Number of classroom teaching hours of A1 teaching model for each student: 31 hours of general teaching (background), 14 hours of theory-into-practice (practical group tutoring and skill development) and 0 hours of guided academic activities. Up to 10% of face-to-face sessions can be substituted by online teaching, in accordance with the course schedule published before it begins.

3. Ubicación en el plan formativo / *Academic Context*

Breve descripción de la asignatura <i>Course description</i>	Introduction to Sociology focuses on What Is Sociology? What Is Sociological Theory? The Development of Sociology, the Major Theoretical Perspectives, Basic Sociology or pure sociology, Applied and Clinical Sociology. Sociology is the scientific study of social behavior and human groups. Specifically is related to: How relationships influence people's attitudes and behavior; How societies develop and change.
Objetivos (en términos de resultados del aprendizaje) <i>Learning objectives</i>	Students should know and identify the origins or beginnings and the role of sociology in the science of society. Similarly, they should know and understand the contributions of the different sociological currents, the basic theoretical concepts which articulate the subject. They should also be able to explain the functioning of the society and recognize the future social tendencies. Students seek to acquire the necessary abilities in order to be able to analyze the social reality understanding the reasons for the social phenomenon and the functioning of society. Students should develop a wide critical capacity, as well as social curiosity and interest in the social phenomenon and the functioning of society.
Prerrequisitos <i>Prerequisites</i>	Students should speak, write and understand English.
Recomendaciones <i>Recommendations</i>	It is recommended to attend classes regularly, to make use of best practice in class and to be punctual. Besides, it is recommended that the student is able to read and understand texts in English. A condition essential to pass the subject is to write correctly and without spelling mistakes. It would also be valuable that the student possesses certain inquietude and curiosity for the discipline. This will make possible the acquisition of the necessary knowledge and capacities to create a critical view of social reality. In the field of this subject, curricular adaptations and the necessary support will be provided to students with functional diversity.
Aportaciones al plan formativo <i>Contributions to the educational plan</i>	Students should demonstrate that they understand and possess knowledge of an area of study rooted in the Secondary Education and, therefore, if they make use of advanced text books, they are used to deal with a level of knowledge that is at the forefront of the study area. Students should have a capacity to collect and interpret relevant data to subsequently express a valid opinion that includes a reflection on important issues of social, scientific or ethical nature. Students should know how to use their knowledge at work professionally and demonstrate the acquisition of competences through the construction and support of arguments and the resolution of problems within the study area. <p>Metodología general <i>Methodology</i></p>	<p>The specified criteria should be respected in the evaluation systems for every subject of the area.</p> <p>EB Basic Teaching:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Option A: objective test (70%) will consist of an exam for the evaluation of the student's acquisition of knowledge, as well as the capacity of the student for using the mentioned concepts in a context of interpreting of society. - Option B: Students could also choose continuous evaluation. Enseñanzas básicas (EB) <i>General teaching</i>	70% General Teaching: taught to a complete group of 60 students. It contains the theoretical teaching, methodological foundations and essential concepts of the discipline. It could be used the creation of conceptual maps and presentations in class; conferences, workshops, projections, visits, etc. may be introduced as well. Conferences, projections, visits, etc. may be introduced as well.
Enseñanzas prácticas y de desarrollo (EPD) <i>Theory-into-practice</i>	30% Theory-into-practice: taught to small groups of 20 students. Its contents are about laboratory practices and the development of the case studies which make easier the students' acquisition of competences. Practice and Development Teaching classes are designed for students to participate actively and to deepen in the basic contents for development through individual and collective activities. Those activities will consist of documentaries and audiovisual materials, role-playing, stimulation, teamwork, problem solving, visits to institutions/NGOs or institutions/NGOs visiting the class etc. The search of information in sources such as the internet or the library could also be carried out.

Students enrolled in a mobility program or a program for high-level athletes, as well as students affected by work or serious health problems or reasons of force majeure duly accredited, will have the right to be evaluated during the first session through a single test evaluation system. To do this, they must report changes in their circumstances to the program coordinator before the end of the teaching period.
