

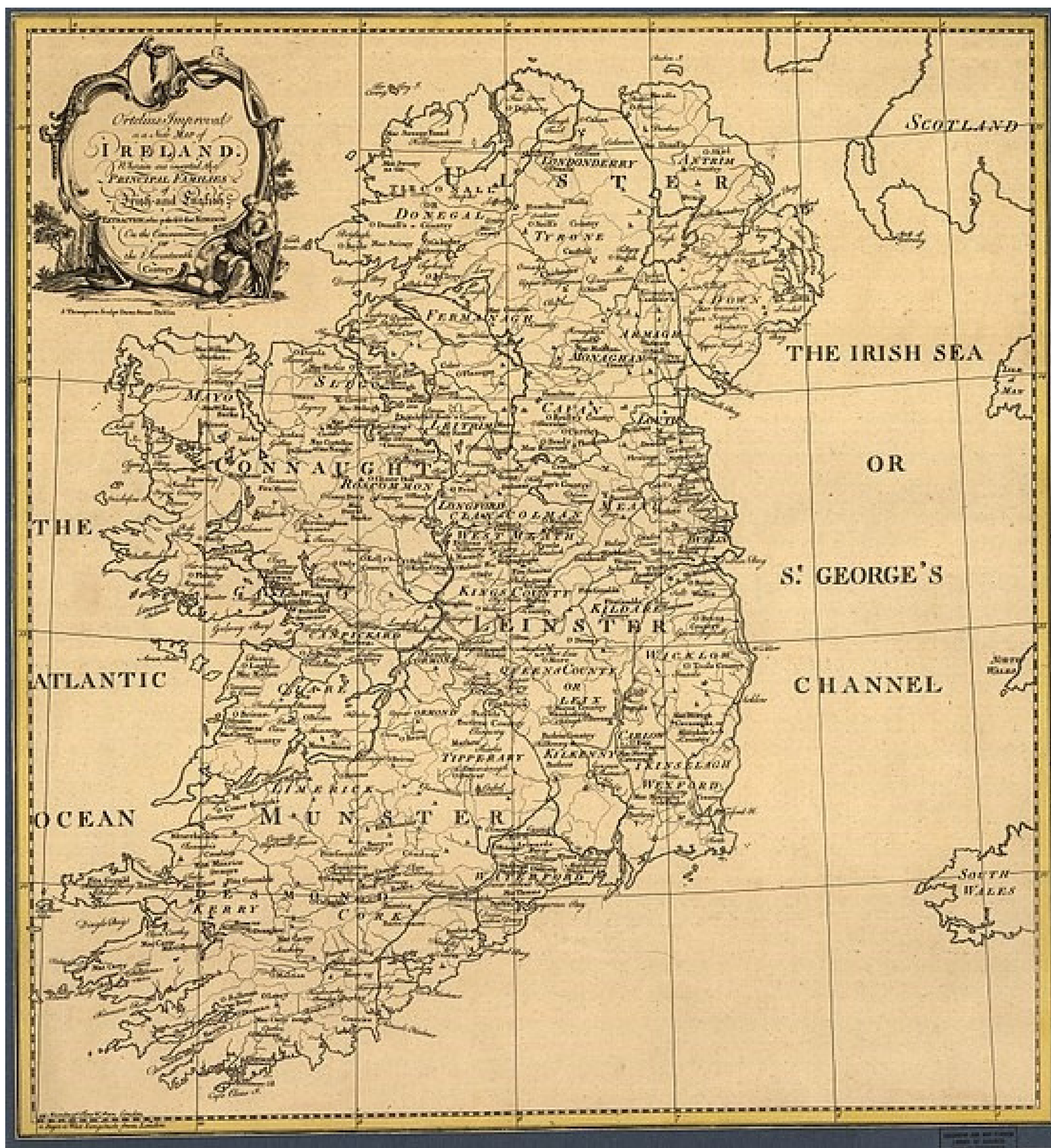

In the last twenty-five years an impressive amount of works has contributed to improve our knowledge of Ireland and of the Irish in the Atlantic world during the early-modern period. A number of seminal studies have mapped the complex web of cultural, economic, political, and religious networks which connected Ireland with the Atlantic world. This seminar aims to discuss the current state-of-the arts with the leading experts in the field and to explore new perspectives for assessing the position of Ireland within the Atlantic and European context. The seminar will focus on a series of key themes like commerce, migration, politics, religion, and religion and it will cover an extended timeframe which goes from the early seventeenth century to the first half of the nineteenth century.
